

Assessment Checklist

Coming to an assessment with everything required makes the assessment experience much better, faster, and more comprehensive. If you're not sure you need to bring a certain type of paperwork, bring it. It's better to have too much information rather than not enough.

Things to Remember When Coming for an Assessment:

	Be prepared to stay approximately 2-3 hours for the entire assessment process. Do not bring
	children with you.

Come 15-20 minutes before appointment time to complete initial paperwork.

Bring all required paperwork (especially DWI including BAC at time of arrest, court/arrest related),
all medication, and current Medicaid or insurance card. If you do not have your documentation,
you will need to obtain a copy of it from the county clerk's office. If your records are no longer
available, you will need to obtain a written statement from the clerk's office saying that the
records are not available.

If you have been assessed elsewhere, you <u>must have documentation from the prior assessor</u> including the date of your assessment and the treatment or education recommendation. <u>DWI</u> assessments are valid for 6 months. If you have not entered treatment within 6 months of your assessment, a new assessment will be required.

Bring assessment fees:

- o General \$100
- DWI \$100 for each outstanding DWI
- Out of State DWI \$100 + \$75 processing fee
